A Special Tribute

Hats 4 the Homeless began as one young man's mission to bring warmth and comfort to those who had so little. John Carroll would gather friends every year and together, they would take to the New York City streets to distribute hats, gloves, and scarves to those experiencing homelessness.







After John passed away suddenly in 1998, his family formed Hats 4 the Homeless in his memory. For several years, the organization has provided Care For the Homeless with thousands of (mostly) homemade hats, gloves, and scarves, as well as donated socks. Their efforts ensure that the frigid winter months are a bit easier to manage for those who are without a permanent shelter and/or unable to afford winter clothing.

This year, after years of soliciting and collecting thousands of items, the main organizer of the effort—who, like so many humble heroes that do this work—has never wanted any public recognition, decided to retire. And, she designated CFH as the primary recipient of all future donations. As a result, we've received an amazing bounty of items to carry on John's mission to help homeless New Yorkers keep warm.

Our heartfelt and warmest thanks go out to all who joined us in this effort.



CFH is Now in All 5 Boroughs!


We're excited to announce the launch of a new health care delivery site on Staten Island!
